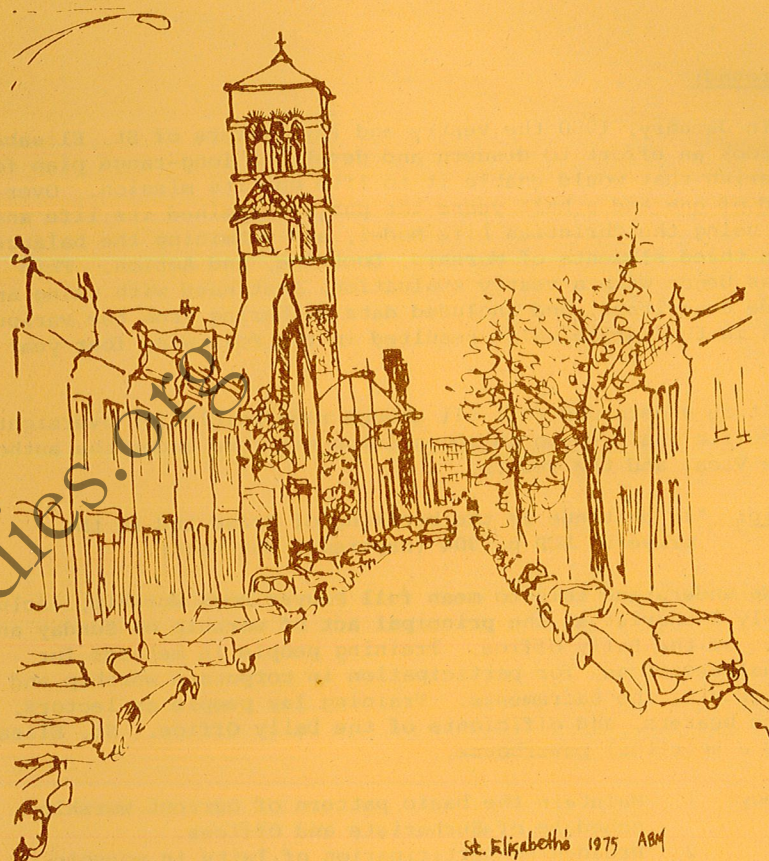

THE CHURCH'S MISSION: "To restore all people to unity
with God and each other in Christ"
BCP p. 855

Background:

In January, 1980 the vestry and lay leaders of St. Elisabeth's undertook an effort to discern and develop a long-range plan for the parish that would enable it to live out its mission. Over a period of one and a half years the parish examined its life and gifts using the Christian Life Model, and examining the balance of the three elements of Worship, Doctrine, and Action. This process began with a vestry evaluation, continued with using an outside consultant, and included data gathering from the various guilds in the parish which resulted in the following four year plan.

It is understood that all groups responsible for oversight of specific goals do so in cooperation with and under the authority of the Vicar and the vestry.

Worship: "to continue in the breaking of bread and in the prayers" BCP p. 304 (Baptismal Covenant)

We understand this to mean full Prayer Book worship, including the Holy Eucharist as the principal act of worship on Sunday and the use of the Daily Office. Training people in methods for personal devotions, for participation in corporate worship and for receiving the sacraments. Training lay people as lectors, chalice bearers, and officiants of the Daily Office. St. Elisabeth's a spiritual powerhouse.

- Strategy:
1. Maintain the basic pattern of current worship schedule of Eucharists and Offices.
 2. Broadening participation of laity in worship.
 3. Maintain vestments, worship supplies, altar linens, etc.
 4. Continue to hold a parish retreat yearly.
 5. Participation of parish members in full sacramental life.
 6. Maintain meetings of all Guilds on a regular basis as scheduled.
 7. Actively seek new members for all Guilds to be trained; encourage present members to recruit.
 8. Continue educational work regarding the sacrament of Penance.
 9. Maintain area of sale of devotional tracts, prayer books, religious articles, etc.
 10. Keep door open for personal devotions (when staff is on site).

spiritual life. For use alone or with spiritual guides.

- 16. Establish a guild of trained spiritual guides. Fall, 1984
- 17. Develop education program on spiritual dynamics --put in a form that could be conducted by lay catechists and/or spiritual guides. Fall, 1983
- 18. Revise parish prayer list using dates of Baptism St. Elisabeth's Day, 1981
- 19. Develop stronger sense of "holy space" - silence before and after Mass, private prayer in church, general reverence, slow down, reverence toward the Blessed Sacrament. Fall, 1982 St. Mary Magdalene Guild
- 20. Healing: advertise regular schedule for healing service after Sunday Mass. Spring, 1982

Doctrine: "to continue in the Apostles' teaching and fellowship" BCP p. 304 (Baptismal Covenant)

Teaching the basics of Scripture and Holy Tradition. Bringing people in contact with the Truth that is the city of God. Helping people to know The Story of The People of God as their story

- Strategy: 1. The parish will continue offering all programs of Christian education currently operating under the Christian Life Institute, including:
- A. New Member Class - to be offered in some form for all new members, establishing the ability to respond to various time requirements.
 - B. The Christian Life - as the basic offering for adults.
 - C. Parents' Nights - two or three times per year.
 - D. At least one short-term bible study per year.
 - E. Continue offering special educational programs during Lent.

- 2. Continue our current approach to Christian education of our children, so that each child can:
 - A. Come to know the love of God in Christ.
 - B. Learn that they have a place in the Church and in God's Kingdom.
 - C. Learn the basics of Christian life and tradition.
 - D. Come to know themselves to be respected, valued and trusted as persons with identity and vocation.
 - E. Learn to relate the teachings of the Church to their own lives.
- 3. Continue to build resources in our parish library, adding some new titles each year, focusing on titles likely to have long-term use. To encourage use of the library, books will be reviewed periodically in the parish newsletter.
- 4. The offering for young people (catechism class) will be continued, as it has been developed, with minor revisions.
- 5. To continue to develop all of these programs, the Guild of St. Ignatius of Antioch, parish catechists, will move toward self management and cooperate with the Vicar in overseeing educational offerings, focusing on the following objectives.

- 7. Church School - develop a schedule of areas to cover over a five-year period. Spring, 1983 St. Ignatius

- 9. Bring all Church School teachers up to standards as stated in job description. Fall, 1984 St. Ignatius
- 10. Review Church School teacher job descriptions and revise as needed. Fall, 1983 St. Ignatius
- 11. Find a librarian for the parish library. St. Ignatius
- 12. Develop an improved system for keeping record of titles, lending procedure, etc. Fall, 1984 St. Ignatius
- 13. Develop an adequate section in library for children and youth. Fall, 1982 Church School Teachers & Y. P. F.
- 14. Do a complete review of Young People's Catechism Class and make needed revisions. Fall, 1984 St. Ignatius
- 15. Develop a series of questions and answers to be used at announcements at Eucharist (presented by members of St. Ignatius Guild) in the following areas. Spring, 1982 St. Ignatius
 - A. The Story of the People of God
 - B. Scriptures
 - C. Book of Common Prayer
 - D. Christian Moral Vision
 - E. Devotional Societies and Fellowships in the Church
 - F. Train people to use the Daily Office

- 16. Revise job description for Guild of St. Ignatius based on experience. Fall, 1982 St. Ignatius
- 17. Research gaps in history of St. Elisabeth's. Fall, 1982 St. Ignatius
- 18. Write paper including history; format for tour of Church building; list of clergy; put in integrated attractive booklet form. Spring, 1984 St. Ignatius
- 19. Classes and sessions re: marriage and family; renewal of marriage vows, general teaching re: preparation for and upholding of sacraments. Spring 1983 - Spring 1984 St. Ignatius

Action: "to represent Christ and His Church and bear witness to Him wherever they may be" BCP p 855 (Catechism)

We understand this to be Corporate action of evangelism, advocacy, service and stewardship. The parish involved in the fullness of Christian action by giving attention to each of these expressions of faith. Enabling lay people in their vocation and ministry.

A Advocacy and Service "Strive for justice and peace among all people and respect the dignity of every human"

- Strategy:
1. supporting the work of the South Philadelphia Team Ministry, the Urban Parish Coalition, the Fairmount Team and related groups
 2. Continue support for community organization efforts within the parish "boundaries". Make use of City Action Fund. Stay in contact with Crisp/Ucan, Spin, Dixon House
 3. Continue procedure that allows policy of making meeting space available to neighborhood groups that serve the community.
 4. Expand summer program so more participants can be secured: move toward increased self-support of programs

Objectives

1. Vicar and lay leaders of the parish will be encouraged to make themselves available to speak at other parishes and interested groups.
2. Support and develop urban mission instruments for advancing urban mission.
3. Initiate and/or explore with others an urban parish training program (diocesan and/or national) that focuses on equipping clergy for urban parish ministry
4. Enable parish leaders to become more familiar with issues of urban mission strategy, including reading material from Urban Caucus, "Stay in The City", etc. Especially Vestry, Catechists, Church School Teachers.
5. Develop a stable source for the food cupboard,

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develop structure and capacity that enables the meeting of needs on a regular basis.

- 6. Establish a Day Care Center explicitly an Episcopal Center, to serve as possible base for parish school.
- 7. Investigate possible use of endowment fund as resource to enable housing development or to meet other social needs with adequate concern for internal needs of parish.
- 8. Begin to develop plans and resources for a parish school.
- 9. Develop group of lay visitors to sick, shut-ins, lapsed members.

B. Evangelism "Proclaim by word and example the Good News of God in Christ"

To proclaim and share the faith that people are brought into a relationship with Jesus Christ in the fellowship of His Church

- Strategy:
- 1. Continue to develop an approach that combines a Catholic inclusion of the many and a Catholic discipline and maturity, i.e., ethnic groups, whites, asians, blacks.
 - 2. Maintain Episcopal signs, properly hung in neighborhood.
 - 3. Work with South Philadelphia parishes and/or Team as appropriate, secure special funding

1. Develop ways to deal with those that come - accept as starting point for access to homes, others, etc., learn to be more direct in "laying the claim" of Christ and His Church; work on inclusion of children who come without parents	Fall '82	Evangelism Team
2. Put together packets of a new members (normally used with new member class) include: parish brochure, SPTM weekday worship, pledging information, information on Episcopal Church, articles published	Fall '81	Evangelism Team
3. Work with Denise to get article finished and published	mid summer '81	Denise

- 4. Get remainder of current Evangelism flyers out. Summer '81 Staff and Evangelism Team
- 5. Develop system for efficient distribution of printed material to neighborhood
- 6. Work on better use of community newsletter - content, format, schedule Fall '81 Staff
- 7. Establish at least one "outreach center" (store front) as resources become available Evangelism Team
- 8. Increase membership and activity of Evangelism Team. Move toward it becoming self-managing under Vicar's general oversight Late Fall '81 Evangelism Team
- 9. Work toward identifying group, able to fulfill duties of welcoming and tour conducting February '82 Greetors
- 10. New Asian population: develop in cooperation with South Philadelphia Team Ministry occasional services in private homes groups in various neighborhoods of parish As resources available Evangelism Team

C. Stewardship: "And God saw that it was good"

A faithful use and enjoyment of all creation, our resources and our gifts. A concern for the effect on the coming generation.

- Strategy:
- 1. Continue regular system of pledging that calls members to a standard of proportional and sacrificial giving.
 - 2. On-going system of property maintenance and repairs.
 - 3. Continue to identify and develop gifts talents of parish members.

Oversight: "The Vicar is to exercise oversight that will provide for, protect and enable wholeness in parish life"

We understand this to include: transforming Community, Spiritual Development and Management/Administration so that the congregation may be led into the Holy Order of Christ, to enable spiritual formation, to envision and plan

- Strategy: + Maintain regular meetings with Vicar and Warden.
- + Continue regular fellowship and community
- + Annual parish data gathering and evaluation
- + Annual vestry evaluation
- + Maintenance and monitoring of existing organizational structures
